Greetings from Bobby and Genny Wright

It's a cold and gray winter day here close to Wien, MO. I'm praying the snow misses us, as there is still ice left over from yesterday. Bobby started to go to Macon, but, after spinning around on the blacktop, he decided he didn't really need anything after all!

I had quite an experience with my back in November. I went to election training on the Thursday before and all was well. Sometime on Friday, I moved wrong and got an awful pain in my lower back. By Saturday night, I was afraid it might be kidney infection, so we went to the Macon ER. No infection and the doctor adjusted my back and I felt a bit better. We went to church the next day and I asked for prayer that I would be able to get through working the election. I got to Wien at 5:30 and, with a bit of babying from my co-workers, I was even able to deliver the ballots to Keytesville that evening. I got home and, before I got to the

Thankfully, I had an appointment with an orthopedic doctor the next day for another issue. I told them my left side was much more of an issue than my right. Dr. Main looked at me and said that I have scoliosis. The X-ray showed a mild case, but lots of inflammation. He gave me a cortisone injection the next day and after having a numb leg for two hours, I have not had any more pain. I am very careful how I move though as I cannot have another injection until February if it happens again. I had an injection over 10 years ago and I will be very happy if this one lasts that long! I had surgery on my foot the Monday after all this happened.

My foot is healing nicely after my surgery and I will be able to wear the shoes that keep my other foot from hurting so badly. My Mom's genes and 35 years on concrete did not do my feet any favors. Those high heels in my teen years were not smart either. It makes me cringe when I see anybody wearing them now!

Bobby is finished with his Physical Therapy and the head guy told me he was amazed at how far he has come since his shoulder replacement. It is good not to see him flinching as often as he did for a while.


