From Our Kitchen to Yours:

Salami Roll-Ups

On the run?

These are perfect for last minute takeouts.

- 1 carton (8oz) whipped cream cheese
- 1/4 pound hard salami, finely chopped
- 2 Tbsp dill pickle relish
- 4 flour tortillas (10 inches) room temperature

In a small bowl, combine the cream cheese, salami & pickle relish. Spread over tortillas. Roll up tightly; wrap in plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 15 minutes. Unwrap & cut each tortilla into 1" slices

Yield: 3 1/2 dozen (these go great with pasta salad,

cottage cheese, vegie plate or watermelon on a hot day).
