From Witness Tree Land & Livestock Farm {From July}:

Another stretch of hay-cutting weather this week thank goodness. A few days shorter than the last one, but we'll take it. The hay is SO thick, lots of clover, but the breeze is helping it along drying out. Our barns are from 1908, so consequently we square bale mostly, so we can fill the lofts, but also round bale in some fields with the help of a neighbor's Gehl.

We had a great time at Neal's plowing, even though we arrived late on Saturday. Great food as always, and it was nice to visit with everyone and admire the teams and teamsters, of which there were many. The new building is sweet! I think I can safely say that Neal has us beat on "collectible treasures". Now he needs another new building to house them all and open up a museum (or a horse-drawn equipment rental business, LOL).

A professional photographer friend of mine has asked to come out and take pics of some of the livestock for a project she is doing on rare breeds. What this really means is that it is time to trim and powder everybody so they will look their furry or feathery best. The first order of business in this regard will be trimming up Tommy, the spotted draft mule. We cannot have hairy, disheveled ears and a spiky mane and tail and call ourselves respectable now, can we? Then the Brabants get their turn addressing manes and tails that border on dreadlocks. 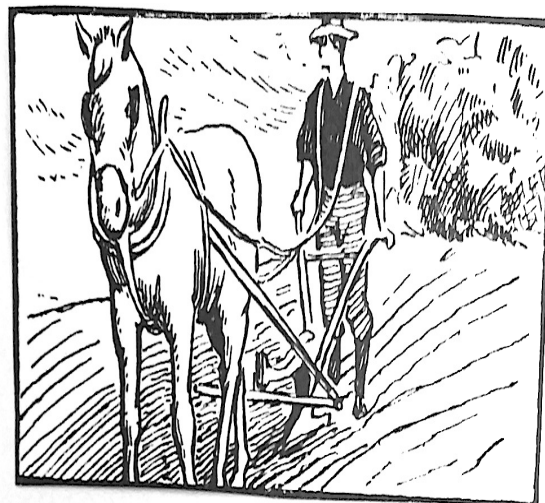
