
From Our Kitchen to Yours:

Butterfinger Bars 1/2 cup dark corn syrup 2/3 cup butter, melted 1 cup brown sugar 1 tsp vanilla 1/4 tsp salt 4 cups oats 1/2 cup peanut butter 6 oz chocolate chips

Lightly grease a 9" X 12" pan. Mix all ingredients, except peanut butter & chocolate chips. Pour mixture into the pan, a bake for 15 minutes. Allow time to cool, & carefully cut into 3" X 1" bars.

Melt peanut butter & chocolate chips together on low heat, stirring frequently. Spread onto cooled bars.
